High School Students

AUFRICHT FAMILY FUND STUDENT AWARD*

This award is for Calgary students graduating Grade 12 and entering first year at the U of C or SAIT, pursuing an undergraduate degree or diploma. Applicants demonstrate financial need, high academic standing, and leadership and community involvement. \$4,000-\$5,000, one or more awards, renewable for three consecutive years. Apply to: CF. Deadline: May 30.

BEYOND THE NORTH SCHOLARSHIP*

Established to help a grade 12 student graduating from a Fairview, Alberta area high school (Fairview High School, Fairview and Area Learning Store, St. Thomas Moore Catholic School, Hines Creek Composite School, or Worsley Central School) attend a recognized Canadian university. Applicants must be entering a four-year undergraduate degree in the upcoming year, and demonstrate high academic achievement, community involvement, and future goals and aspirations. \$1,000, one award. Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 1.

BILL GIBSON BURSARY*

Bursary is for Calgary students graduating Grade 12 from the CBE or CCSD accepted to an undergraduate degree program at a Calgary post-secondary, demonstrating financial need and community leadership. \$10,000, renewable for three years.

Apply to: CF. Deadline: May 15. New bursary available in even years.

CALGARY BLACK CHAMBERS LEGACY SCHOLARSHIPS*

Aligned with the Calgary Black Chambers pillars of Mentorship, Scholarship, Fellowship, and Advocacy, there are five named legacy scholarships. Applicants must demonstrate good academic standing and school and/or community involvement. Applicants must be enrolled in an undergraduate degree or diploma program at a Calgary post-secondary institution, or have graduated from a Calgary high

school and attending a Canadian post-secondary institution. Along with a brief essay, applicants must submit a letter of reference. Two awards available for each of the five scholarships; one award is for a Grade 12 student graduating this year and entering the first year of their undergraduate degree or diploma program, and one award is for a student entering second year or beyond of their undergraduate degree or diploma program. \$2,500, ten awards. Apply to: CF. Deadline: July 15.

CLAY RIDDELL COMMUNITY HERO SCHOLARSHIP*

The Clay Riddell Community Hero Scholarship honors youth who exemplify the traits that Mr. Riddell lived by – leadership, integrity and generosity. Given annually to up to two deserving youth heroes who are connected with a participating Shaw Birdies for Kids presented by AltaLink charity. Student must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident and demonstrate community involvement. Must be currently enrolled in Grade 11 or graduating Grade 12 this year, and entering first year of full-time studies within three years of receiving the scholarship; in good academic standing for acceptance to technical school, college or university. *\$7,500, one to two awards*. *Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 30.*

FRASER W. LOCKWOOD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP*

For students (Canadian citizens or permanent residents) entering first year of full-time undergraduate studies immediately following graduation from Grade 12 from either a Public (CBE) or Separate (CCSD) school in Calgary. Preference is given to students with financial need whose families have a connection to the Filipino community. Students must demonstrate commitment to community development and leadership. Has contributed to the community by volunteering through church, community organizations, athletics, and cultural or political activities. *Min.* \$2,500, one award, renewable. Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 30.

GORDON SKITCH SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for a Grade 12 student with Cerebral Palsy enrolled in high school (CBE and CCSD). Scholarship is to motivate a deserving student to prepare for post-secondary who may be discouraged from doing so by reason of financial need. Community service, financial need, and scholastic achievement are required. \$300-\$400, one award. Apply to:

Cerebral Palsy Association in Alberta.

JOHN AND ANN SCHEER MEMORIAL AWARD*

This award recognizes a graduating Grade 12 student from a Wheatland County high school who is pursuing post-secondary education, has shown personal perseverance and has demonstrated service to their community. \$1,000, one award. Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 1.

JULIA TURNBULL LEADERSHIP AWARD*

For students entering their first year of full-time undergraduate studies directly from Grade 12 from either a CBE, CCSD, or Calgary Charter School. School and community leadership, preferably involvement in student politics, interest in volunteering internationally. \$1,000, five or more awards.

Apply to: CF. Deadline: May 30.

KERMET ARCHIBALD & JACOBA VAN DEN BRINK ENTRANCE BURSARY

In honour of Kermet Archibald and Jacoba Van den Brink, multiple renewable bursaries



for graduating Grade 12 CBE or CCSD students entering a Canadian post-secondary institution in any of the hard sciences, engineering, geology, biology, veterinary medicine, pre-medicine or health sciences, or any designated trades program or vocational programs related to healthcare or justice/legal studies. Applicants must demonstrate financial need, academic progress and submit an essay describing impact of receiving funding. Up to \$25,000 based on program, multiple renewable awards. Apply to: EducationMatters. Deadline: May 1.

KERRY DYTE EDUCATION AWARD*

For a Grade 12 student who graduated from a CCSD high school in Calgary during the year the application is made. Demonstrate outstanding citizenship and leadership, financial need. *Min.* \$4,000, one award. Apply to: CF. Deadline: May 30.

KIDS COME FIRST STUDENT AWARD

Provides student awards to graduates of the CBE and the CCSD entering first year studies at a post-secondary institution. Demonstrated financial need, with consideration of academic merit. *Min.* \$3,500, two awards. Apply to: EducationMatters.

M. CECIL BROWNLEE BURSARY

Scholarship is to encourage deserving students in Grade 10 to prepare for post-secondary education, who might be discouraged from doing so by reason of financial need. Applicant must show academic achievement, citizenship and financial need.

One award per CBE school, variable amount.

Apply to: EducationMatters.

MARGUERITE PATRICIA P. BANNISTER MEMORIAL DEGREE AWARDS

In memory of Marguerite Patricia P. Bannister, scholarship is for CBE and CCSD (City of Calgary Schools only) Grade 12 students accepted to the U of C in any area of study. Preference for applicant to be from a single parent family. Applicants must show financial need. Volunteer and/or leadership activities encouraged. Awards are renewable for up to three consecutive years of study. \$4,000, seven renewable awards. Apply to: EducationMatters. Deadline: May 1

RICHARD R. & LINDA A. SINGLETON AWARD

This scholarship was established to assist CBE high school students who have demonstrated academic abilities, community service and have financial need to realize their goal to attend post-secondary institutions. \$2,000, two awards. Apply to: EducationMatters.

SAGE & SHEA O'NEILL MEMORIAL BURSARY

Established in memory of Sage and Shea O'Neill, this bursary supports women motivated to improve their lives through education, pursuing careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) or Creative/Fine Arts fields. Applicants must be graduating Grade 12 this year from Canmore Collegiate High School, entering first year of a full-time two-to-four-year undergraduate degree or diploma program at an accredited AB, SK, or BC post-secondary institution. Applicants submit a one-page summary outlining aspirations, abilities and strengths, family circumstances and financial need. \$2,000, two awards. Apply to: Canmore Collegiate High School.

SCOTT BOBYE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is in memory of Scott Bobye, and recognizes proficiency of a Grade 12 student entering university in the Junior Achievement business program. *Approx.* \$2,000, one award. *Apply to: Junior Achievement of Southern Alberta.*

SHANNON BURWASH AWARD FOR ENCOURAGEMENT IN EQUINE & AGRICULTURAL STUDIES*

Established to honour the legacy of Shannon's love for the horse and extensive involvement in the Quarter Horse industry. Shannon was an active director and treasurer for both the Quarter Horse Association of Alberta and the Canadian Quarter Horse Association, and was an Alberta director for the American Quarter Horse Association. Her involvement also extended to Equine Canada committees. Applicants must be entering first or second year of study at a Canadian post-secondary in any field of study with emphasis on horses, agriculture, agribusiness, animal health technology or equine veterinary medicine.

\$1,000, two awards. Apply to: CF. Deadline June 1.

SHELAGH NEARY MIKULAK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR LEADERSHIP & INNOVATION IN LIBRARY STUDIES*

In memory of Shelagh Neary Mikulak, for a student in any year of study, including entrance, at a Canadian post-secondary enrolled in a Library and Information Sciences or Library Technician program, (Certificate, Diploma, or Graduate degree) who demonstrates a passion for the library sciences field. Passionate about librarianship, aptitude for information and library systems and love of reading. Financial need. Approx. \$2,000, two awards. Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 1.

SMILLIE FAMILY EDUCATION AWARD*

Established in recognition of the community service contributions and professional achievements of the extended Smillie family, this award encourages and supports post-secondary educational opportunities for students who have resided in rural towns, villages, hamlets or on agricultural operations across Canada. Applicants must be entering first or second year of a full-time undergraduate degree or diploma at a qualified Canadian post-secondary institution and should demonstrate active leadership and volunteerism in their community.

\$2,000, two awards. Apply to: CF.

Deadline: June 1. THORNER/JOHNSTON/DIMARZO FAMILY

NEW IMMIGRANT BURSARY

Recognizes students' potential to realize their dreams, academic interests, and contribute to their community. Applicants must be newcomers to Canada within the past five years, demonstrate financial need, and submit a short essay. *Up to* \$16,000, one or more renewable award. Apply to: EducationMatters. Deadline: May 1.

ALTON ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP

Recognizes academic achievement as determined by Mother Earth's Children's Charter School.

Min. \$400, one award. Apply to: Mother Earth's Children's Charter School.

ANDREW PATTERSON MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Andrew Patterson, this award is for a graduating Grade 12 student planning to attend an apprenticeship program in the trades at an accredited post-secondary institution. \$500, one award.

Apply to: Wheatland Crossing School.

BATES WARDLE AWARD FOR LIFEGUARDS*

Established in 2018 by family and friends in memory of Frances (Frankie) Bates. This award celebrates those who volunteer to help others and recognizes the importance of the role that lifeguards play in the community. For students aged 12 and upwards to Grade 12, pursuing certification or advancing training as a lifeguard. Well rounded students with emphasis on volunteering/improving their community attending: Bow Valley High School, Cochrane High School, St. Timothy Jr./Sr. High School, Innisfail Middle School, Innisfail High School, St. Marguerite Bourgeoys Catholic School or École Secondaire Notre Dame High School (residency within the Innisfail catchment school boundary). \$750, two awards. Apply to: CF. Deadline: April 30.

BILL AND LORRAINE KIMMETT MEMORIAL VALEDICTORIAN SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to the valedictorian at Strathmore High School. \$1,000, one award. Strathmore High School.

CARLIE BELL MEMORIAL GOOD SAMARITAN AWARD

Honoring Carlie Bell, this award recognizes the accomplishments of a wellrounded Grade 12

student active in the community who has attended their entire year of Grade 12 at Three Hills High School. Award recognizes a student who has demonstrated the qualities of a Good Samaritan, service to others through care, outreach and selfless contribution to others. \$600, one award nominated by three classmates. Apply to: Three Hills School quidance counselor.

CENTRAL ALUMNI PERSONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

Scholarship recognizes graduates at Central Memorial High School who have achieved high academic excellence and achievement in the areas of athletics and citizenship. \$350, two awards. Apply to: Central Memorial.

CHRIS AND BETTY HARVEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Chris and Betty Harvey, Rimbey Junior Senior High School selects a graduating Grade 12 student with qualifying grades to enter university, college or technical school. Award is based on financial need and community involvement. \$1,000, one award. Apply to: Rimbey Junior Senior High.

CHRISTINE CARRON MATH AWARD

In memory of Christine Carron, an 18 year old Ridgetown District High School (RDHS) graduate who died in July 1977 as a result of complications from a dental procedure. She was an Ontario scholar, the Graduating Class Grad Queen, and the President of her class. Math was one of her favourite subjects. Friends and family started the award for the student receiving the highest math marks in the graduating class at RDHS. \$200-\$250, one award. Apply to: RDHS.

CLAPHAM BURSARY

Awarded annually to a Central Memorial High School student planning to attend a post-secondary institution. The bursary is based on the following criteria: financial need, satisfactory academic standing, extracurricular activities, for example, involvement in sports or music. \$500, one award.

Apply to: Central Memorial.

CLAUDE GAUVIN SCHOLARSHIPS

In memory of Claude Gauvin, a prominent builder and community supporter, these awards are for graduating Grade 12 students to begin a construction trade career in any of the following areas: electrician, carpentry, plumbing, architectural drafting and landscape design. *Variable amount. Apply to:*Strathmore High School.

CONNOR RHYS SIMPSON MEMORIAL AWARD

The selection committee at Western Canada High School selects the recipient based on the following criteria: positive attitude towards life and school, determination to improve self and school, and participation in football or rugby programs.

Min. \$200, one award. Apply to: Western Canada High School.

DENNIS ANDERSON CITIZENSHIP AWARDS

These awards recognize outstanding students who show civic engagement, involvement in their student council and community leadership. One award per school, variable amount. Nominated by: Bishop Carroll and Central Memorial High School

DR. G. FRED MCNALLY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in fond memory of Dr. McNally, a noted Alberta educator, this scholarship supports a graduating student from Western Canada High School with outstanding academic performance, good citizenship, extracurricular activities, school and community volunteerism. \$1,000, one award. Apply to: Western Canada High School.

DR. JAMES DUNCAN CAMPBELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Dr. James Duncan Campbell Memorial Scholarship was established to honor the life and accomplishments of Dr. James Campbell. Dr. Campbell's connection to Crescent Heights High School was a significant part of his life. His father was a teacher there, Dr. Campbell was an alumnus of the school and his five children also graduated from Crescent Heights. Recognizes excellence in academic achievement. \$475, one award. Apply to: Crescent Heights High School.

DR. M.E. KOZIOL MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Dr. M.E. Koziol to recognize high school students graduating from the County of Vulcan pursuing a career in medicine, nursing or health sciences. \$500, one award. Apply to: County Central High School Vulcan.

DRUMHELLER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for Grade 12 students from a Drumheller high school continuing education at an accredited post-secondary institution. Applicant must show scholastic excellence, volunteerism, leadership, be caring and helpful to others, personal integrity and values, and financial need. \$5,000, two awards, renewable for two years. Apply to: Drumheller Valley Secondary School


EDWIN B. CALLAWAY SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Edwin B. Callaway, scholarship is for a student with proficiency in written or oral communication skills in such areas as parliament, creative writing, literature, history and debating. \$200, one award. Apply to: Mother Earth's Children's Charter School.



EIMER SCHOLARSHIP FUND AWARD FOR HEALTH CARE*

This scholarship was established to provide financial support to students graduating this year from Grade 12 and entering their first year of a practical health care program directly related to patient care at BVC, MRU, SAIT, or U of C. Applicants must demonstrate financial need. \$2,000, one or more awards. Apply to: EducationMatters. Deadline: May 30.



F.S. BAKER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

In memory of Frank Baker, born in 1925, who grew up during the depression, and for financial and other reasons was unable to attend post-secondary. He had a strong character, integrity and willingness to serve others and community. The scholarship identifies these traits in applicants to provide financial support and help to go to post-secondary. Scholarship is for students showing financial need, academic achievement and community service. Applicants show community service by submitting an essay titled, "Making a Difference." Approx \$850, two or more awards. Apply to: Bishop McNally High School.

JACK & JANET KWONG BURSARY

To support students in financial need who are attending Calgary Chinese Public School. *Min.* \$1,200, one award. Apply to: Calgary Chinese Public School.

JANE MCCAIG AWARD

Scholarship is for a Grade 9, 10, or 11 student providing motivation to continue learning through a very challenging period in their life. Applicant must be an all around good student who has exhibited significant improvement, is enjoying school and is serving as a role model. *Approx. \$1,000, one award. Apply to: Calgary Academy.*

JIM & MERTIE CHILTON SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Jim and Mertie Chilton, scholarship is for positive, highly motivated academic Grade 12 student having the highest academic average in the sciences and involved in leadership roles. Provides financial support for pursuit of post-secondary education. Approx. \$2,000, one award. Apply to: Willow Creek Composite.

JONATHAN ANDREWS MEMORIAL AWARD

In memory of Jonathan Andrews who was exceptionally committed to Western's Athletic Program. To be awarded to a Grade 12 student at time of nomination, accepted into post-secondary who has shown continuous support for Western Canada High School's Athletic Program. Including but not limited to supporters, trainers, managers, photographers, statisticians, mascots, sports medicine practitioners, etc. \$2,000, one award.

Apply to: Western Canada High School.

JONATHAN PAUL SCOTT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship is for a Grade 1-12 student at Queen Margaret's. Student has made significant progress during the school year, has returned for a subsequent year, and is in financial need. *Approx. \$300, one award. Apply to: Queen Margaret's School, Duncan, BC.*

JORDAN ROPPEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of Jordan Roppel, this scholarship supports graduates of Standard High School who are continuing their education. Community participation, extra-curricular school activities and overall character of the applicant will be considered. \$1,500, one award. Apply to: Wheatland Crossing School.

K.C. YEUNG MEMORIAL AWARD

This scholarship is to help students attending the Calgary Chinese Public School. Approx. \$600, one award. Apply to: Calgary Chinese Public School.

Scholarship is for top academic students involved in extra-curricular activities to take on the role of class valedictorian. \$1,000, three awards. Apply to:

In memory of Michael Copeland, this scholarship recognizes students or staff at Strathcona-Tweedsmuir School who, by way of a specific act or project, have made significant contributions to the well-being of the school. *Approx. \$450, one award. Apply to: Strathcona-Tweedsmuir.*



NICK GALLELLI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship for a Grade 12 student enrolled in St. Francis Senior High School in Calgary. Student must plan on pursuing post-secondary education with a major in business, business administration, commerce, economics, finance or accounting. Purpose of award is to motivate a deserving student in Grade 12 to prepare for university or other post-secondary education, who might otherwise be discouraged by reason of financial need. Community service is also required. *Approx.* \$1,000, one award. *Apply to: St. Francis Senior High School.*

OKOTOKS ROTARY CAREER OPPORTUNITY AWARDS*

The Rotary Career Opportunity Fund is a program of the Rotary Club of Okotoks. For students graduating this year from an Okotoks High School, entering first year of study at an accredited Canadian post-secondary institution and demonstrating financial need. Student must show leadership and motivational skills through participation in student, community, and/or business activities. Academic achievement must be adequate to gain admittance to the student's school and program of choice. \$1,500, two awards (for students graduating from Foothills Composite, Holy Trinity Academy, St. Luke's Outreach Okotoks, Cameron Crossing School, or The Centre for Learning@HOME). Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 15.

OWEN HART MEMORIAL AWARDS*

In memory of Owen Hart who died while working for WWF. These awards recognize students who are motivated to improve their lives through education. Applicants must be graduating Grade 12 from one of the following schools: Forest Lawn, Western Canada, Ernest Manning, Crescent Heights, Sir Winston Churchill and planning to attend an accredited Canadian post-secondary institution in the next academic year. Applicants must have at least a 70 per cent average or post-secondary entry requirement. Preference given to students employed part-time. Financial need may be considered. \$4,000, ten awards. Additional honorariums may be awarded. Apply to: CF. Deadline: June 15.

PATRICIA G. HUNT SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is for a student attending Mother Earth's Children's Charter School. *Approx. \$150*, one award. *Apply to: Mother Earth's Children's Charter School*.

TING HOKNIN MEMORIAL AWARD

This scholarship, supported by the Sino-Canada Culture Association, helps students attending the Calgary Chinese School. *Approx. \$500, one award. Apply to: Sino-Canada Culture Association.*

Must demonstrate financial need and commitment to achieving their goals through part-time work, volunteering or pursuit of interests (music, art, sports, etc.). \$1000, four awards. Apply to: Madawaska Valley District High School, Barry's Bay, ON.

CALGARY BLACK CHAMBERS BUSINESS SCHOLARSHIPS

For Black students entering second year or beyond of an undergraduate Commerce or Business
Administration degree or diploma program. Applicants must demonstrate good academic standing and submit an essay that summarizes their involvement in community and views on diversity in finance, along with two letters of reference from community leaders.
\$5,000, three awards. Apply to: CF. Deadline: July 15.

CALGARY BLACK CHAMBERS LEGACY SCHOLARSHIPS*

Aligned with the Calgary Black Chambers pillars of Mentorship, Scholarship, Fellowship, and Advocacy, there are five named legacy scholarships.
